

McKownville Tree Planting Program

Beautify McKownville — and improve your property!

Order a tree for your yard or the street right-of-way next to your house for planting in mid to late October.

All trees are bare root, at least 1.25 inches in caliper (trunk diameter) and approximately 5-7 feet tall.

Bare root trees are less expensive, lighter, and easier to plant than balled-and-burlapped or container grown trees, and adapt more readily to their new sites.

Your Responsibilities:

Choose a location for your tree:

Before placing your order please let us know where you intend to plant the tree. We will coordinate with the Town Highway Department to obtain approval for planting in this location.

Call UDIG-NY:

Before planting your new tree call UDIG-NY at 811. They will have all underground lines marked so you'll know where not to dig.

Select the appropriate tree:

If your tree is to be planted beneath utility lines, please select a tree suitable for that location. Please see tree descriptions below.

Watering:

Newly planted trees require approximately 1 inch of water per week. It is essential that you provide water when rainfall is insufficient. In dry spells, deep-water 2 to 3 times a week with a hose on slow trickle.

Suitable for under power lines:

Amelanchier 'SpringFlurry' (Serviceberry)

1 1/2", \$141.00

Small specimen tree with a "flurry" of white flowers in spring. Vibrant orange fall color. Full sun/partial shade. 28'H X 20'W. Low maintenance. Native cultivar.

Malus 'Adirondack' (Crabapple)

1 1/4", \$114.00

A compact, dense tree with a strongly upright form. Extremely heavy flower display. White flowers, red 1/2" fruits. Excellent disease resistance. 18'H X 10'W. Native cultivar.

Do NOT plant under power lines:

Acer 'Bowhall' (Red Maple)

1 1/2", \$126.00

An excellent street tree for a narrow space. A sturdy tight form. Yellow, orange and red-orange fall color. Very tolerant of urban environments. 40'H X 15'W. Not suitable under power lines. Native cultivar.

Celtis occidentalis 'Chicagoland' (Hackberry)

1 1/2", \$126.00

A fast growing tree with a rounded crown and a high canopy. Green foliage in summer and yellow fall color. A good urban tree that performs well in adverse conditions. Birds consume the small fruits during fall migration. 50'H X 40'W. Not suitable under power lines. Native cultivar.
