

THIS INDENTURE made this Twentieth second day of October in the year of our Lord 1846, thousand eight hundred and forty six, **BETWEEN** Kate a

McKown, Eliza McKown & Ann McKown of the City and County of Albany, New York, parties of the first part and William Knowles of the Town of Guilderland and County of Albany, a special party of the second part.

WITNESSETH That the said parties of the first part in consideration of the sum of **Four Hundred and Fifty Dollars**, to us duly paid has sold and by this presents does grant and convey to

to the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns **ALL** that certain lot of one parcel of land lying & being in the town of Guilderland at Newtownville on the north side of the Blank road bounded and described as follows. Beginning at a point in the great watered limpsike in the west line of a lot now owned by Dunn which point is distant 94 links on a course south 60 degrees 40 minutes west from the north west corner of the dwelling house standing on the lot last above mentioned and run from said point along the west line of said lot now or formerly owned by Dunn north 48 degrees 30 minutes east six chains to a post standing in the Corporation line then along the same north 41 degrees 30 minutes west three chains 14 links then south 48 degrees 30 minutes west six chains seven and eight links to a post in the north side of said limpsike then through the same south 55 degrees east 3 chains 24 links to the place of beginning containing 177 acres of land surveyed Oct 11th 1846 by W. H. Dunsenland & son

WITH THE APPURTENANCES and all the rights thereto and to be held

to the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever
