

THIS INVENTURE made the thirty first day of March nineteen hundred and twenty seven
BETWEEN Alexander Mc Kown, residing in the City of Albany County of Albany and State
of New York, and Eva F. Mc Kown, residing in the town of Guilderland, County of Albany
and State of New York as Administrators with the will annexed of the said, Chattels
and credits of William Mc Kown late of the town of Guilderland County of Albany and
State of New York, deceased parties of the first part, and
Caroline M. Knowles and Margaret A. Knowles both residing in the town of Guilderland
County of Albany and State of New York as joint tenants, with the right of survivor-
ship to either, parties of the second part,

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS William Mc Kown, the above named decedent, during his lifetime and on the
1st day of May 1924, entered into a contract in writing with William J. Knowles of the
town of Guilderland Albany County, New York for the purchase by said William J. Knowles
of certain real property owned by said William Mc Kown and hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS the said William J. Knowles thereafter and on the 26th day of March 1927 duly
assigned all his right, title and interest in and to said contract to said Caroline M.
Knowles and Margaret A. Knowles, parties of the second part; and,

WHEREAS the said William Mc Kown died on the 8th day of November, 1924 before the
said contract of May 1st, 1924 had been performed seized of the premises therein
described; and

WHEREAS the parties of the first part on the 23rd day of December 1924 were duly
granted letters of administrators with the will annexed of the goods chattels and
credits of said William Mc Kown and duly qualified as such administrators on said date
and are still acting as such; and

WHEREAS the parties of the second part have tendered to parties of the first part
the consideration specified in said contract of May 1st, 1924 as the balance of the
purchase price of said real property and have demanded a deed of said premises; and

WHEREAS the parties of the first part have duly petitioned the Surrogate's Court
of the County of Albany for a decree directing them to make and deliver to parties
of the second part a deed of said premises; and

WHEREAS the parties of the first part by a decree of the said Surrogate's court duly
made and entered on the 20th day of March 1927 have been duly directed to make and del-
iver such deed to parties of the second part,

NOW THIS INDENTURE witnesseth that in pursuance of the said decree of said court
and in consideration of the premises and of the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3000.)
and other good and valuable considerations paid by the parties of the second part, the
parties of the first part do hereby grant and release unto the parties of the second
part their heirs and assigns forever;

All that certain farm or parcel of land, sometimes referred to and known as the
Ross Farm, situate, lying and being in Mc Kownsville, in the town of Guilderland,
County of Albany and State of New York bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a White Pine sapling in the line of lands formerly owned by William Mc
Kown (grandfather of said decedent) and run thence along Betty's line south forty
eight (48) degrees forty five (45) minutes east thirty two (32) chains and forty (40)
links; then south eight (8) degrees east twelve (12) chains and twenty (20) links to a
post; then south fifty four (54) degrees west twenty one (21) chains; then north seventy
five (75) degrees west forty three (43) chains and sixteen (16) links then north forty
five (45) degrees thirty (30) minutes east forty four (44) chains and five (5) links
to the place of beginning; containing one hundred and forty three (143) acres and one
quarter (1/4) of land.

Being the same premises conveyed by Alexander Ross and Hannah, his wife to John Mc
Kown by warranty deed dated January 17, 1864, and recorded the same day in Albany
County Clerk's office in Book 2vol Deeds page 58; and the same premises first described
in the warranty deed of John Mc Kown and Catharine, his wife to James F. Mc Kown dated
April 23, 1880 and recorded in Albany County Clerk's office January 7, 1881 in Book
1st of Deeds page 179.

Also all that other plot of ground adjoining on the west the above described premises
containing about three acres of land and being more particularly described as follows:

On the north by Guilderland Town Road, No 42; on the east by the above described Ross
Farm, on the south by the Charles Reinemann farm (Formerly the Albert Ziehm Farm)
and on the west by the Neu Farm (not said to be owned by Jerome Reinemann); being a

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part of an original tract of eight (8) acres from which two (2) acres were heretofore sold to one Ziehm, and three (3) acres to one Schwartz; the said tract of eight (8) acres being described in the warranty deed of William J. Mc Kown and wife to James M. Mc Kown dated April 24, 1868, and recorded in Albany County Clerk's office February 17, 1870 in Book 200 of deeds page 255.

This conveyance is made subject to a certain lease, or a renewal thereof of a part of said premises more particularly described in said lease dated November 20, 1882 and made by deceased as lessor with John Gerst and Paul Martens as lessees, said lease being for a term of three (3) years commencing April 1st, 1883, with the privilege to renew for two years from April 1st 1886.

~~X~~ Parties of the first part expressly reserve the right to enter upon the three (3) acre parcel hereinbefore described and to cut and remove therefrom any green or dead wood thereon. Parties agree that the following provisions shall be construed as covenants running with the land, to wit:

In the event the grantors desire to run a street north and south through the said premises the grantors will allow said grantees at their expense to cut a sixty (60) foot street (this width to include space for sidewalk) through the land owned by grantors adjoining said premises on the north and known as the twelve acre lot, being the second parcel of land described in a certain deed from John Mc Kown to James M. Mc Kown, recorded in Albany County Clerk's office in Book 100 of Deeds page 173, but grantors shall have the right to decide where said street, which will run approximately at right angles to Western Turnpike with which it will connect, shall be cut, said grantors reserving the right to have the said street run so that said premises on the north of the premises hereby conveyed shall be divided to best advantage.

If within five (5) years after May 1, 1884 the consent of the town authorities of the town of Guilderland, Albany County New York is obtained for the widening of the Guilderland Town Road Number 42, which said road is used as an entrance to premises above described and which said road connects the Western Turnpike with Mc Kownsville School House Road, then grantors agree to convey or make any instrument necessary to convey, thirteen and one half feet (13 $\frac{1}{2}$) of the land owned by them between the Western Turnpike and Betty's line (That is along the twelve acre lot hereinbefore referred to) and bounded by said Town Road. ~~X~~

Together with the appurtenances and also the estate which the said decedent had at the time of his decease, in said premises and also the estate therein which the parties of the first part have or have power to convey.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the premises herein granted unto the parties of the second part, their heirs and assigns forever as joint tenants with the right of survivorship to either.

And the parties of the first part covenant that they have not done or suffered anything whereby the said premises have been encumbered in any way whatever.
