50% report building flooding problems

- Rising ground water is the #1 suspected cause at individual residences, followed by the "unfavorable location".
- Flooding definitely related to storm water:

46 percent say it begins during the storm

40 percent say after a rain storm

But other times only about 8 percent.

- Things people do to cope:
  - **-** Sump pumps − 40%
  - Water proofing walls 21%
  - Empty out basement 18%
  - Re-grade property 16%
  - Outside drainage work 4%
  - Packup power for sump 4%
  - One person had to resort to sand bags.

## Priorities

Mixed – no clear consensus

Highest ranking (lowest score): Minimize Street Flooding & Maintain Neutral Drainage

Next: Minimize "cross drainage"

• Finally, about 48% say they would be willing to pay something in taxes to address this problem.
