The documents that I would like to have access to include----available inspection reports relating to the project; Notice of Intent concerning the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Report; and the Letter of Acknowledgement concerning the project. If there are additional documents that would shed light on what is going on--SPDES documents, for example, and Environmental Impact Declarations---those would also be appreciated.

The Association regrets that no notice about the project was forwarded to the neighborhood concerning the rebuilding project----this has caused much anxiety by neighbors on Warren Street, Loughlin and those living on other nearby streets. So we now find ourselves trying to gain accurate information concerning the project and whether it is meeting the standards set forth in laws, rules and regulations.

As I understand the Freedom of Information laws, there should be no cost imposed on the Association for looking at the documents----though reasonable charges may for imposed for obtaining copies of documents.

Since the neighbors are terribly upset by what is going on in the land near their backyards, I would appreciate it if these documents could be made available sooner rather than later.
