Below is a link to an FAQ that UAlbany created to answer neighbors question regarding the UAlbany Foundation's recent purchase of the Holt-Harris property.

We are not moving to demolish the buildings on the property at the current time and the property does not include the LaGrange home and is not historic property. Our immediate concern is addressing any safety issues since the houses and barn are in advance disrepair. Part of this parcel was once home to prominent Albany resident Mayor Billy Barnes, who built a house in 1905 that burned down in 1985. The land was later home to Judge John E. Holt-Harris, whose family built the two existing homes and whose descendants sold it to the University at Albany Foundation. Neither the land nor the structures on it are listed on the Register of Historic Places.

We have set up a tour of the property for Mr. Reeb and Guilderland Town Supervisor Peter Barber for this Friday and we are planning to meet with neighbors to the Holt-Harris property Monday night to discuss the purchase and answer any questions.
