For many years it has been the endeavor of the Residents of McKownville to have and maintain a lovely and unusually well kept Hamlet of reasonable zoning and with modest taxes, yet with most adequate conveniences. Over the years, the Improvement Association has been quite successful in working with its citizens, and in all co-operative endeavors with the Town Government for a desirous community.

Although there may have been temporary or isolated evesore conditions in the past, the residents on Norwood Street - most who have lived here twenty years or more - have not been exposed to such, and certainly never subjected to a condition as presently exists at the premises of #35 Norwood Street.

Inasmuch as the new occupants of the residence have arrived nearly three months ago, there can be seen no justification for the total out-of-doors amount of strewn and standing materials, "non-becoming" other than for business zoned areas.

Therefore, we the undersigned request that the Improvement Association fully have the matter reviewed for expeditious remedial actions - with the owner - and/or the Town of Guilderland Supervisor's Office, as may be required.

We propose no intention for allowing the stated type of condition to become the new environmental or standard for all residents of McKownville - incoming or otherwise.
