Bethlehem, Guilderland delay water line

A planned emergency water line connection between the Bethlehem and Guilderland water systems will not be made until summer, Bethlehem Town Supervisor Thomas Corrigan has said.

Corrigan said although the towns have agreed to make the connection, which would cost approximately \$2,000, he did not anticipate construction would begin until summer.

The connection, which would serve the North Bethlehem area of both towns in an emergency situation, has been

said.

The connection may be made on Fliegel Avenue in North Bethlehem, where the Bethlehem water line is close to a Fliegel Avenue water line carrying

water from Westmere to McKownville.
