Dear John:

On October 10, 1979 from 4:30 to 6:30 PM I had a meeting with John S. Deffigos at the A.E. Smith office building, Albany, New York. During that meeting Deffigos stated, as an Aside remark, that the Governor's office was greatly interested in the Pyramid-Crossgates project in Guilderland and in its completion. He stated that the Governor's office, moreover, had a continuing interest and that more than one discussion had been held with the governor's office concerning it.

Mr. Deffigos, at the time of the meeting, was a staff member of the Economic Affairs Cabinet, an inner-circle analytical group which had daily access to the Governor and served the Governor in developing new and therefore sensitive economic policies. A list of such policies might include the development of a "Battery Park City" in New York, a "Rolls-Royce" plant in Buffalo, and a new federal-state energy policy, developed with the aid of the Governors in the Northeast and the Middle Atlantic states and co-ordinated with the aid of the Economic Affairs Cabinet staff.

The bias by the Governor's staff towards Pyramid-Crossgates development is prejudicial to our interests here in McKownville. This same bias will nullify the testimony during the DEIS hearing and make a sham of the proceedings. I hereby request, as our attorney, that you seek relief from this excess burden.
